The Veterans SA 10-year strategy focuses on areas of importance to the veteran community and its delivery

This strategy has been developed in collaboration with veteran communities across South Australia, whose vital input and feedback has shaped the aims and actions within. The agency has already implemented various initiatives that aim to empower and engage the veteran community, whilst also educating the wider South Australian community about the valuable contributions of our veterans and their families. It will continue to seek input from current and former serving members, families and veteran organisations to ensure that the priorities of the agency are consistent with the needs of the community.

# M About Us

In 2008, the South Australian Government was the first state jurisdiction to recognise the importance of a state-based Veterans' Affairs portfolio and as a result Veterans SA was established.

We envisage a strong, vibrant, well-supported and represented veteran community, inclusive of all generations that is understood and acknowledged by all South Australians.

As the lead advocate across the Government of South Australia on matters relating to veterans and their families, Veterans SA works with ex-service organisations and civic groups that provide support to members of the community when and where it is needed most.

The agency also plays a role in sharing information about services, programs and opportunities across South Australia that are available to families and those who have served in the Australian Defence Force.

Veterans SA works with the veteran community to ensure commemoration activities are supported and that occasions of military and historical significance are remembered and preserved for all South Australians

Veterans SA supports the Veterans' Advisory Council, which provides independent advice to the Premier, on matters of concern to the ex-service community in South Australia.

A **veteran** is a person who is serving or has served in the Australian Defence Force as a Regular/permanent or Reserve/part-time member.

The **veteran community** is inclusive of veterans and their families with a direct link to a Service or a veteran. This includes spouses, widows, widowers, partners, former partners, carers, children, parents, siblings and relatives of serving or ex-serving members, and should include anyone with an evident link to, or interest in, matters associated with veterans' welfare or wellbeing.





#### **Empowering Community**

Create the space to encourage a forward-aspiring community that harnesses shared experience to advocate for better outcomes for veterans and their families.

- Continue to promote Home Base SA as a reliable online resource for current and former serving members and their families.
- Deliver a pilot 'co-work, co-play' program that allows Defence partners to work collaboratively with on-site childcare provided.
- Deliver a 12-month pilot regional outreach program to connect veterans in regional areas with support services and increase awareness of services available to the community.
- Explore opportunities to increase training pathways for veterans and their families through Skills SA funding programs.
- Investigate the feasibility of a veteran and Defence families expo that provides information to the veteran and Defence communities about employment, transition, education, health and wellbeing, aged care support, etc.
- Support the professional development of South Australian former-serving members through a second Veterans' Mentoring Program.
- Explore opportunities for increasing cohesion within the veteran community by raising awareness and facilitating educative activities

- Continue to provide funding assistance to organisations that support veterans and their families through the Capacity Building Grant Fund.
- Continue participation in online and face-to-face ADF Transition Seminars and provide feedback and statespecific guidance to organisers wherever possible.
- Deliver a program of community forums that provide the opportunity for the veteran and Defence families community to provide feedback directly to the agency on matters of importance.
- Deliver a pilot program to establish the systems and processes for the establishment of work trials across the state government for DVA vocational rehabilitation program participants.
- Continue collaborative participation in the Transitioning ADF Members Collaborative Working Group, alongside Northern Adelaide Local Health Network (NALHN), Australian Defence Force (ADF) and Adelaide Public Health Networks to address the needs of transitioning members.
- Continue to promote veteran related programs and events through social media and other networks.
- Continue to participate in the Veterans Wellbeing Taskforce and Commonwealth State and Territory Committee (CSTC) and any working groups that develop from these.

#### **Promoting Inclusion**

Engage with the South Australian community to raise awareness that those who serve, and their families, actively contribute to the benefit of the community.

- Continue to publish stories and content that highlight the successes of veterans and their families and challenge the stereotypes around veterans.
- Continue to produce and promote digital and hardcopy resources that educate the wider community about the experiences and value of veterans and their families in the workplace and community.
- Explore the viability of developing a veteran employer network.
- Engage with Department for Education to investigate potential for increased cultural awareness in schools of Defence/military life and assist in the development of recommendations for implementation.
- Create a resource to educate the community about Defence life and its impact on families and children.
- Continue to be involved in the Commonwealth State Veterans Employment Working Group (sub-committee of CSTC) and action any relevant initiatives.

#### **Data Informed Policy Best Practice**

Commit to the ongoing pursuit of data relevant to the veteran population to help further inform evidence-based strategic priorities and policy development across government.

- Distribute a second Australian Defence Force
   Arrivals Survey to collect data and feedback
   from Defence families that have recently posted
   to South Australia to help shape support for
   this sector of the community.
- In collaboration with Defence Families Australia, produce a survey that will highlight barriers faced by Defence partners relating to transfer of professional registrations from state-to-state and take necessary actions to address these issues.
- Continue to support and collaborate with state government agencies that are working in areas where significant veteran issues exist, such as incarceration and homelessness.
- Explore opportunities and support the Department for Education to better identify and meet the needs of ADF and veteran children within the education system.
- Engage with Department for Education to advocate for flexibility in school zoning for Defence families.

#### **Honouring Service**

Empower the South Australian community to honour the service and sacrifice of service women and men and the families who support them.

- Continue to provide financial assistance through grant funds to ensure that Anzac Day and other dates of significance can be commemorated.
- Continue to provide financial assistance through grant funds to enable/facilitate projects and initiatives that honour the men and women who have served and South Australia's military history.
- Provide financial assistance through a grant fund to support commemoration activities for the 80th Anniversary of the end of World War Two.
- Collaborate with Department for Human Services to advocate for and support the expansion of eligibility for veteran concessions and be a leading state in this area.
